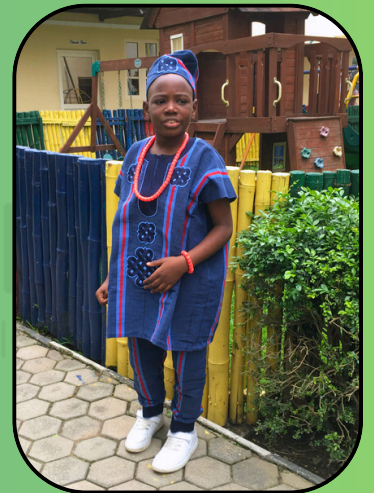

CULTURAL DAY

On 30 September 2025, Patrick Speech and Languages Centre held its annual Cultural Day in patriotic recognition of Nigeria's Independence Day. The event, organized by the Events Committee, brought together students, staff, and parents in the assembly hall, all beautifully dressed in traditional attire. Guests were welcomed into a decorated venue at 11:00 a.m., after which the program opened with a brief reflection on Nigeria's independence by Mr. Gbemiga before he introduced the day's hosts, Mr. Michael and Miss Yemisi.



The celebration featured a variety of engaging activities for students across all classes, including “Toss the Bean Bag,” musical chairs, and a “following instructions” challenge delivered in multiple native languages with the support of parents. A visual activity titled “Guess the Tribe,” created by Miss Seyitan, added to the excitement as attendees matched Nigerian tribes to curated image collages. Throughout the program, staff members ensured smooth transitions between activities while refreshments—moi-moi and assorted drinks—were served to parents and caregivers.

Closing remarks by the Head of School, Miss Funmi, at about 1:30 p.m. brought the celebration to a joyful close.

VISIT TO LTV/EKO FM

The PureSouls Learning Foundation and Patrick Speech and Languages Centre (PSLC) paid a courtesy visit to Lagos Television (LTV) and Radio Lagos/Eko FM, reinforcing their long-standing relationship with the Lagos State Broadcasting Corporation. The visit also served as an opportunity to congratulate the newly appointed General Manager of LTV, Olori Adesola Kosoko, the third woman to lead the station in its history.



During the meeting, the PSLC team commended LTV's remarkable 45-year legacy as Nigeria's first state-owned television station and its consistent dedication to education, public enlightenment, and community-focused broadcasting. Special appreciation was extended to the producers, reporters, and crew members who have supported autism awareness over the years. This partnership was notably celebrated in 2017, when PSLC presented LTV with an award for its outstanding contributions to autism advocacy.



The organisations also provided an overview of their mission and impact, highlighting PSLC's 19-year journey in supporting children and adults with autism and speech/language challenges. With over 50 children successfully integrated into mainstream schools and more than a thousand families reached through therapy outreach programmes, PSLC reaffirmed its commitment to inclusion. As the first IBCCES-certified autism centre in Nigeria, PSLC continues to champion early intervention, empowerment, and community awareness.

VISIT TO LTV/EKO FM

Looking ahead, PureSouls and PSLC expressed readiness to deepen collaboration with LTV and Radio Lagos as part of activities leading to their 20th anniversary in 2026. This includes partnering on the premiere of a documentary film on autism scheduled for January 2026, as well as additional awareness initiatives throughout the anniversary year. Both parties expressed optimism about renewed collaboration that will strengthen public understanding of autism and foster greater inclusion across Lagos State.
